Summary of Application Process

After they have been nominated by their home university, students will be provided with a link to our online application.

Supporting Documents Required

- Official academic transcript
- English Language Requirements Evidence (for non-native English speakers – see below for more)
- Scan of a valid passport

Entry Requirements

Academic Requirements

Nominated students should have a GPA of 3.0 on a 4.0 scale or equivalent. Applicants with a lower GPA may be considered on a case-by-case basis, with endorsement from the home university.

Language Requirements

Single semester students: we will accept a [Statement of Language Level Form](#) signed by the home institution, confirming that the student's level of English is B2 or above on the [Common European Framework of Reference for languages](#) in line with requirements for the Standard Visitor Visa. Alternatively, we also accept any formal certification from the approved range of official qualifications listed at [Undergraduate Degrees - English Requirements | Study Here | The University of Aberdeen \(abdn.ac.uk\)](#). These must have been issued within two years prior to planned commencement at Aberdeen.

Full year students: we will accept a range of official certificates and qualifications to evidence English language level, in line with requirements for the Student Visa. These are listed at [Undergraduate Degrees - English Requirements | Study Here | The University of Aberdeen \(abdn.ac.uk\)](#). These must have been issued within two years prior to planned commencement at Aberdeen.

Accommodation

University accommodation is available to all incoming students providing they apply by the deadline. Students will be emailed information on how to apply once they are accepted into the programme.

Most incoming students opt to live in Hillhead Student Village, which is largely self-catered accommodation. Students may also apply to live in Adam Smith House, which has catered options. Visas

Students coming for one semester (six months or less) with a non-UK or non-Irish passport should enter the UK on a Standard Visitor Visa. The cost and process of applying for this visa depends on where the student is applying/country of domicile and nationality. Students are not permitted to work in the UK while studying on this type of visa and must leave the UK within six months of the date of arrival.

Students coming for longer than six months on a non-UK or non-Irish passport must apply for a student visa. This visa has a strict application process. Students are generally allowed to work up to 20 hours per week on this type of visa. Cost of Living

UK Visas and Immigration indicate that international students should have £1,023 for each month that they will spend in the United Kingdom. Although no official advice is given for standard visitor visa students, we suggest that semester exchange/study abroad students also budget £1,023/month for living expenses. Orientation and Arrival

Students are normally given a dedicated orientation on the Monday after arrival weekend. This is then followed by a week of registration and induction where students will meet with their Go Abroad Tutor (academic advisor) to finalise their curriculum, complete their registration and acquaint themselves with campus and the city. Further orientation events will be held during welcome week in September / refreshers week in January for the general student population, and exchange students may take part.

Transcripts

At the end of the period of study an academic transcript will automatically be produced and emailed to each student and copied to their home institution, where the home institution is a contractual partner.

Insurance

The University of Aberdeen does not require students to purchase coverage through our institution.

Travel Insurance

Students are encouraged to purchase travel insurance that will cover their personal effects.

Health/Medical Insurance

Single Semester Students: Students coming for six months or less are encouraged to purchase health/medical insurance in their home country before departing for Aberdeen. Although the National Health Service (NHS) in Scotland may provide some free healthcare services to these students, private insurance guarantees that the students will receive the relevant care in a timely manner, as remains recommended as students will likely travel outside of Scotland during their time in Aberdeen.

Full Year Students: International students who require a Student visa to study in the UK also must pay the NHS health surcharge and associated additional costs when applying for a visa. Dual Citizens: Students who have a UK passport will be eligible to use the NHS while in Scotland. Again, comprehensive medical and travel insurance is still recommended in all cases, as students will likely travel outside of Scotland during their time in Aberdeen.

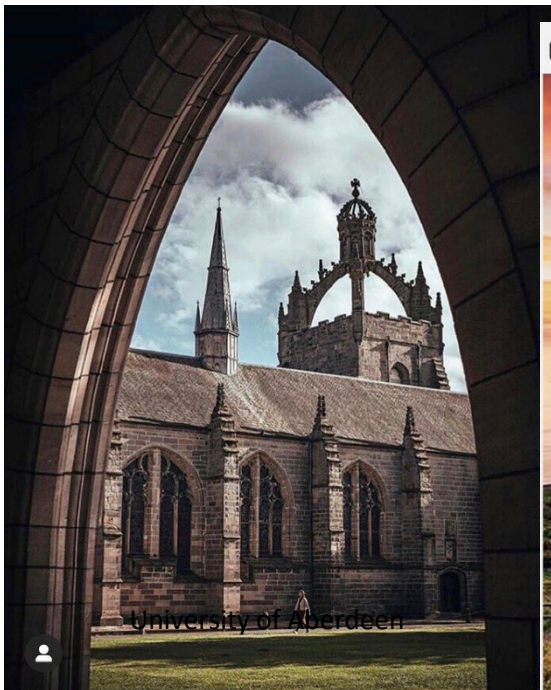
